Research on Effectuation, a logic used by expert entrepreneurs to solve problems in highly uncertain market environments, has seen important developments in the 10 years since Saras Sarasvathy's seminal 2001 AMR paper. New directions for research have been opened, the body of literature is increasing, acceptance in major journals is growing, and the teaching of effectuation is reaching an increasingly large audience of students and entrepreneurs.

Despite these developments, both theory and application of effectuation are being actively co-created with stakeholders around the world. The purpose of the conference is to bring together scholars interested in furthering its development and in emerging as a community. The conference will address issues related to both teaching and research in a workshop format that will be studious, but fun.

Professors Saras Sarasvathy (Darden) and Stuart Read (IMD) are my co-hosts and co-creators for this conference, engaged throughout the event, which will include the

- Teaching: Alternatives to the Business Plan?
- Research: Business plan, business planning and performance.
- Your Research Paper (small group clinics)"Create your first quilt" (exercise Len Schlesinger uses at Babson)
- Teaching materials (what effectuation is not post-it session)

- Beyond just heuristics: Self-selected stakeholder idea (teaching)
- Research Designs Generate research questions and propose research designs for them
